MORE RECOGNITION FOR ONESTONEGROVE

OneStonegrove has been shortlisted for more awards. Judges from the Royal Institute of Chartered Surveyors recently

visited Edgware along with representatives of Sprunt Architects and Rev Simon Rea because OneStonegrove has been shortlisted for more awards. The RICS Awards showcase the achievements of the most inspirational regional initiatives and developments in land, property, construction and the environment. OneStonegrove/St Peter's Church has been shortlisted in the categories of Community Benefit, Design through Innovation and Regeneration. It is the only building to be entered in 3 separate categories. Earlier this year OneStonegrove has also featured in a special article in the highly-regarded national publication Architecture Today.

Rev Simon Rea Pioneering Minister at St Peter's said:

"It's fantastic to see how our joint project continues to make more positive news following on from last year's shortlisting by the National Churches' Trust. We are delighted by this recognition of our shared initiative and the partnerships which have made OneStonegrove such a landmark in the local area. We hope and pray that this can help to bring a greater sense of pride and togetherness for our new community here."

The regional award ceremony takes place on 24th May 2017 at Marriott Grosvenor Square.

GOODBYE PETE

It is with great sadness that we must say that Pete Legate, a long-standing resident of Stonegrove and a key member of the Stonegrove Community Trust Board and St Peter's Church council has passed away. He died peacefully as a result of an accident at work. His sudden and unexpected death comes as a great shock to all who knew and loved him in his families, St Peter's Church and in the local community. Pete was always there to help, always faithful, always wanting the best for others. He had such a heart for young people and such a love for his community and church and was selfless in supporting both. Pete's dedication to



youth work had led to him being given a special award for community service by the Mayor of Barnet. One of the commendations put it like this: "[He] does everything with a smile on his face and is respected by children, young people and volunteers. If every estate had a Pete we would have much stronger and safer communities".

Rev Simon Rea, Pioneering Minister at St Peter's said, "Pete's Christian faith was sure and solid and although he is so deeply missed by so many, we know he is now with God in that place where there is no more death or crying or pain"
